Maine Downtown Center Affiliate Program welcomes city of Hallowell

The Maine Downtown Center (MDC), a program of Maine Development Foundation (MDF), has announced that Hallowell has joined its Maine Downtown Center Affiliate Program.

Hallowell (Vision Hallowell) went through an extensive application process including an online application, a site visit and interview conducted by professional downtown revitalization experts that serve on the MDC Advisory Council. Hallowell also submitted a written commitment to the program.

"We are excited to be chosen as a Maine Downtown Affiliate," says Jamie Houghton, President of Vision Hallowell. "Downtowns are the heart of any community, and our little city has a big, creative heart that we wish to protect and promote using the tools and training that the Main Downtown Center program offers."

The Maine Downtown Center Affiliate Program (MDA) currently supports 17 member communities throughout Maine. All are in the early stages of downtown revitalization and many are working toward achieving "Main Street" designation. MDA offers access to training by state and national downtown development experts, best practices in the field and a network of peers from around the state, but with less rigorous resource and financial investment than the Main Street Maine program.

Over the last several years, MDF has worked with communities such as Hallowell to develop organizational structure, cultivate local leaders and pursue a four-pronged approach laid out by the National Main Street Center.

"I had the opportunity to attend every site visit this year," says Anne Ball, Program Director, Maine Downtown Center. During those site visits, she said, "communities demonstrate good energy, a clear vision and pride in their downtown areas that have made these designations a reality."

Free outdoor recreation activities now offered in Skowhegan

n May, Main Street Skowhegan enrolled three full-time AmeriCorps members as outdoor recreation coaches. Under Main Street's guidance, they are spearheading implementation of the Skowhegan AmeriCorps Outdoor Recreation Program which provides free outdoor recreation activities and trainings to Skowhegan residents.

The outdoor recreation coaches - Alanna Wacome, Travis Basora and Monica Sonner - are planning, developing and leading the

activities which kicked off at the beginning of June. Planned activities so far include trail runs, downtown walks, yoga and meditation in Coburn Park and a family scavenger hunt. Future activities and trainings will also include mountain biking, paddling, snowshoeing, cross-country skiing and more.

Later this year Wacome, Basora, and Sonner will work to establish a gear library so Skowhegan residents can borrow equipment including mountain bikes, kayaks, cross-country skis,

Kneading Conference and Bread Fair

The Maine Grain Alliance will celebrate bread and everything related to it with the annual Kneading Conference and Artisan Bread Fair at the Skowhegan Fairgrounds July 25-27.

The bread fair is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, July 27. Admission is free; parking is \$5. With more than 60 vendors, the fair will offer Maine-made breads and pastries, wood-fired pizza, honey, granola, cheeses, pottery, wooden utensils, kitchen linens and much more. There will also be live music, professional bakers to answer questions, demonstrations and a kids' area.

Slated for July 25-26, the Kneading Conference is an annual gathering of bakers, farmers, millers, scientists, food writers and anyone interested in craft breads and local food networks. Kimberley Bell, founder of Small Food Bakery in Nottingham, England, is this year's keynote speaker. Small Food won the 2018 BBC Award for Best Food Producer in the UK.

River Fest

For five days this summer, Skowhegan will

celebrate recreation and life on the sparkling Kennebec River with its annual – and ever-growing – River Fest event.

From Tuesday, July 30 to Saturday, Aug. 3, Skowhegan's historic downtown will be buzzing with activities both old and new community meals, vendors and a culminating fireworks display on Saturday night. Activities will include raft rides, a glow-stick river run, other river and outdoor programming and events, a craft fair, kids' activities, a golf tournament, the annual Rotary Club lobster bake and Lions Club chicken barbecue, the iconic bed races when teams race beds on wheels down Water Street and more.

Main Street Skowhegan will again host Dinner in the Park, a locally sourced meal that debuted last year at Skowhegan's beloved Coburn Park. The event will take place Saturday, Aug. 3, from 5:30 to 10 p.m. Tickets are \$60 per person, \$110 per couple, or \$400 per table of eight. Tickets will be available in July at dinnerinthepark.com and at the Skowhegan Fleuriste (93 Water St.).

River Fest showcases the downtown Kennebec River Gorge as the future home of the Run of River Whitewater Recreation Area. Run of River will include a whitewater park with wave features for paddling, surfing, tubing, stand-up paddle boarding and more;

an approximately 50-mile four-season trail system on 300 acres in the heart of town; a riverfront promenade and pristine fishing waters with improved fish habitat.

The park will serve as a venue for river festivals and events, attracting significant regional and national whitewater paddling competitions and drawing recreation aficionados, spectators, sightseers and adventure travelers. Fundraising is currently underway for the first phase of the recreation area. For more information, see *runofriver.org*

Craft Brew Fest

On Saturday, Aug. 31, a block in the heart of downtown Skowhegan will close to vehicular traffic for the fourth annual Skowhegan Craft Brew Festival – one of the only festivals in the state to feature all Maine purveyors of beer, wine, cider, spirits and food.

Last year the festival drew approximately 1,200 attendees from across the country and Canada. VIP tickets have sold out each year and this year General Admission tickets will be capped to ensure the festival retains the small-town vibe attendees love.

With 34 brewers anticipated, the event will kick off with a VIP hour featuring free local food samples and specialty brews not available during the general session. The general session will include an array of Maine-crafted libations, while merchants will offer farm-totable fare including organic tacos, chicken wings and more.

Live music by Skowhegan's own Connor Reeves and Maine band Papa Tim and the Desperate Man's Blues Explosion will enhance the festival atmosphere.

The Skowhegan Craft Brew Festival is coordinated by Main Street Skowhegan, and all proceeds benefit ongoing revitalization efforts in Skowhegan.




