

#### RIVERWALK



### Local grains are at heart of Kneading Conference and Bread Fair

he Skowhegan-based Maine Grain Alliance (MGA) will celebrate bread and everything related to it with the annual Kneading Conference and Artisan Bread Fair July 26-28. The bread fair is scheduled from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, July 28, at the historic Skowhegan Fairgrounds. With more than 60 vendors, the fair will offer an array of Mainemade breads and pastries, wood-fired pizza, halvah, honey, butter, oil and vinegar, pottery, wooden utensils, kitchen linens, and more.

Demonstrations will range from bread baking using sourdough—with starters to take home to tortilla making. The children's area will expand this year, and they will be able to prepare, cook and eat their own pizza.

Slated for July 26-27, the Kneading Conference is an annual gathering of bakers, farmers, millers, scientists, food writers, entrepreneurs and anyone interested in craft breads and local food networks.

This year, the conference will be held at Kennebec Valley Community College's Alfond Campus in Hinckley. Just 15 miles south of Skowhegan on U.S. Route 201, the campus includes teaching kitchens, a food science lab, lecture halls, an outdoor wood-fired oven and a 120-acre working farm. MGA is already growing a number of rare and heritage grains on the farm that will be incorporated into conference workshops.

The 2018 keynote speaker will be Sarah Owens, a New York City-based cookbook author, baker, professional horticulturist and instructor. She received a James Beard Award for her first book, "Sourdough," and released her second book, "Toast & Jam," in 2017.

### **River Fest celebrates recreation** and life on the Kennebec

he Kennebec River has always been Skowhegan's lifeblood, and for five days in August the town will celebrate recreation and life on the river with its annual River Fest event. From Aug. 1 to 5, Skowhegan's historic downtown will be brimming with festivities, food and fireworks. Activities will include raft rides, a glow-stick river run, a craft fair, children's activities, the annual Rotary Club lobster bake and Lions Club chicken barbecue, and the iconic bed races when teams race beds on wheels down Water Street.

New this year will be Dinner in the Park, a farm-to-table meal under the stars at Skowhegan's beloved Coburn Park. The dinner will take place from 5 to 10 p.m. Saturday, Aug. 4. Tickets are \$45 per person, \$80 per couple, or \$300 per table of eight; they will be available starting July 2 at MainStreetSkowhegan.org and at the Skowhegan Fleuriste,93 Water St.

River Fest showcases the downtown Kennebec River Gorge as the future home of the Run of River Whitewater Recreation Area. Run of River will include a whitewater park with terraced seating; an expanded four-season trail system on 300 acres in the heart of town; a riverfront promenade and pristine fishing waters with improved fish habitat.

The Park will serve as a venue for river festivals and events, attracting significant regional and national whitewater paddling competitions and drawing recreation aficionados, spectators, sightseers and adventure travelers. Fundraising is currently underway for the first phase of the recreation area. For more information. see RunofRiver.org.

### Third annual Skowhegan brew fest features 30 Maine brewers, free food samples

n Saturday, Sept. 1, a block in the heart of downtown Skowhegan will close to vehicular traffic as an anticipated 30 purveyors of Maine craft beer, wine, cider and spirits take to the streets at the third annual Skowhegan Craft Brew Festival.

Last year the festival drew nearly 1,100 attendees-up from 800 in 2016—from across the country and Canada. The event will kick off with a VIP hour featuring specialty brews not available during the general session. Doors will open for VIP hour at 1:30 p.m., with VIP food options served from 1:30 to 3 and brews poured from 2 to 3 p.m. VIP tickets are limited and have sold out for the past two vears.

From 3 to 7 p.m. an array of Maine-crafted libations will be on tap for attendees to sample, while local merchants

will sell fare ranging from poutine to organic tacos. Free local food samples will be available to all attendees.

The Nikki Hunt Band will perform throughout the festival. A pop/rock group based in central Maine, Nikki Hunt covers artists including Sheryl Crow, Joan Jett, Bruce Springsteen, Sublime, No Doubt, The Doors and U2

Guided tours of Maine Grains at the Somerset Grist Mill will round out this Labor Day weekend eventone of the only festivals in the state featuring all Maine producers of beer, wine, cider and spirits—making for an unforgettable close to summer.
